

Health Inequalities Voluntary Sector Fund 2024

The Humber & North Yorkshire Integrated Care Board has allocated funding to North East Lincolnshire Population Health Management Executive Committee to support actions to address health inequalities within North East Lincolnshire. A number of programmes are being brought forward this year to address the higher burden of chronic disease that afflicts some communities and for the second year we have also established a fund aimed specifically at the voluntary sector to support activities that address health inequalities in communities that are most negatively impacted by poor health outcomes.

Organisations that are considering putting in an application to the fund are encouraged to read the annual public health report 2023 of the Northern Lincolnshire Director of Public Health, Diane Lee, as applications are expected to address one or more of the social determinants of health identified in the report (<https://www.nelincsdata.net/director-of-public-health-dph-annual-reports/>) which are as follows:

We aim to allocate the funding by the end of November and all applications will be evaluated by a stakeholder panel made up of representatives from the health and care partnership, local primary care, the voluntary sector and North East Lincolnshire Council.
